Background

More than most other economies, the agricultural sector heavily depends on a functional ecosystem. In this context, the loss of biodiversity in the agricultural landscape, limiting the functionality of the ecosystem, is a cause of concern. Agri-environment-climate-measures (AECM) are intended to counteract this development. However, when implemented on a per-farm basis, these measures are often not optimally coordinated within the landscape and fall short of their potential results.

The Project

The KOMBI project will develop and implement collective models for agricultural nature conservation in four model regions together with actors from agriculture and nature conservation. Farmers and landscape conservation associations will work together to jointly design the AECM for their region. This is expected to simplify the application for funding and contribute to adapting the measures to the natural conditions and nature conservation goals of the respective model region.

Objectives

The project funded by the German Federal Programme for Biological Diversity develops collective models for the agricultural nature conservation, implements them and evaluates them scientifically. The focus lies on agro-ecological, economic and socio-economic results. A major goal is the dissemination of the knowledge gained to practitioners and policy makers and the consolidation of the project results.
